Last year marked a period of significant growth and opportunity for strategic planning. Over the year, we acted intentionally to apply our learnings from the COVID-19 pandemic, understanding that it had disproportionate and enduring effects on low-income Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AA and NHPI) communities. To leverage the opportunities on the horizon for our communities, we engaged in an extensive strategic planning process with input from our coalition and other stakeholders. This plan centers our work on the resilience of our communities by committing to protect and cultivate healthy, vibrant places of belonging.

In 2022, we also grew our staff size to deepen our support for our growing coalition, including advocating for policies that respond to the needs of our communities and developing culturally specific and accessible resources. We dedicated over 40 percent of our budget as subgrants to the community-based organizations that make up our coalition. In particular, we demonstrated our commitment to racial healing, anti-racism, and multi-racial coalition-building work in local communities by providing flexible funding through the 2022 AA and NHPI Community Resilience Fund. 

Data in the report covers July 2022 - June 2023.

Through 3,573 hours of small business counseling by coalition members:

- 71 new businesses started
- 850 jobs were saved or created


Through housing counseling by coalition members:

- 1,630 households gained access to resources to improve their housing situation
- 59 homeless/potentially homeless individuals obtained temporary or permanent housing
- 232 individuals avoided eviction
- 255 renters improved their living conditions
- 111 individuals avoided foreclosure

Through financial empowerment by coalition members:

- 147 individuals increased monthly savings
- 396 individuals decreased monthly debt
- 222 individuals established or improved credit
- 518 individuals developed a budget
- 15 Agency and Congressional engagements
- The Fair Housing Public Service Announcement reached 120,000 community members with over 80,000 views nationwide
- 11 new member organizations joined the coalition
- 11 community organizations in Seattle, WA, hosted 350 attendees who attended 23 sessions and plenaries and 8 community tours
